Reporting a Student Absence

To report your child absent we have a District Safe Arrival program. These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time. You can use one of the following options:

Option 1: Download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store. The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.

Option 2: Use the SafeArrival website at https://www.sd33.bc.ca/safearrival. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.


Option 3: Call the toll-free number 1-833-698-6567 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

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School Parking

The first parking lot is designated for parent parking. There is also a parent drop off lane for quick "stop and go" parking but if you require a long conversation or are needing to enter the school please park in the marked stalls. We want to keep the "stop and go" lane flowing and moving freely.

There will be no parking in the bus loop during school hours. If you park outside of the school grounds it is prohibited and monitored closely by UFV Impark and you will be ticketed. There is FREE public parking located within walking distance at the Vedder River Dog Park.


Cell Phones / Technology Acceptable Use Agreement
