## School Supplies for 2026 / 2027

For the upcoming school year, the school will be purchasing classroom supplies in bulk for students in Kindergarten to Grade 5. This approach helps ensure consistency, quality, and convenience for families.



**In September once classes have been set**, we will collect payment through QuickPay to cover the cost of these supplies for your child.

### Kindergarten: \$60 / Grades 1 – 5: \$65

For students in Grades 3 - 8, there will be an additional \$8 fee for the school planner.



